Phone Interview: Based on your Online Application, you may be invited to participate in a 30-minute one-on-one phone interview. Tips for Writing an Effective Application Essay

The Common Application no longer requires a short answer essay from all applicants, but many colleges continue to include the short answer as part of a supplement. The short answer essay prompt typically states something like this: "Briefly elaborate on one of your extracurricular activities or work experiences."

It accepts the Common Application, Coalition Application, and QuestBridge Application. All three applications require a personal statement essay plus additional Yale-specific short answers and a Yale writing supplement. For applicants interested in engineering or computer science, there is a third optional essay.
