The return must be filed in duplicate with the Register of Wills of the county in which the decedent resided. Time for Filing and Payment of Tax The Inheritance Tax Return and tax liability is due within nine months after the decedent's death. Interest is charged on the amount of tax unpaid after nine months from the date of death.

The executor will file the decedent's final personal income tax returns for the year they died. They'll determine if the estate is liable for any estate taxes, and, if so, file these tax returns as well. Any taxes due are also paid from estate funds. This can sometimes require liquidating assets to raise the money.

A Step-by-Step Guide to What Happens During Probate

The law states: The inheritance tax is 3 per cent for ascendants or descendants and 10 per cent for others. It is levied on assets worth above Bt100 million. IHT is levied on heirs who are either individuals or Thai juristic persons.

You probably won't have to worry about an inheritance tax, either, because only six states collect this tax as of 2019: Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Nebraska, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. If the decedent lived or owned bequeathed property in any of the other 44 states, you can collect your gift free of an inheritance tax—even if you live in one of these six states.

Three Taxes Can Affect Your Inheritance

The Register of Wills is an elected official, one of whose functions is to determine whether a document offered for probate should be received as the last Will of the decedent. In situations where a Will does not name an executor, the Register determines who is authorized to administer the estate of the deceased.

Other reliefs and exemptions are worth looking into. The estate can also pay inheritance tax at a reduced rate of 36% on some assets if you leave 10% or more of the net value to charity in your will. Additionally, a business relief allows some assets to be passed on free of inheritance tax or with a reduced bill. Gift tax in the UK
